<b>Einzelaktionen</b>			
Aside from the <b>May 15 – July 9</b> large scale deportations – so called “individual actions” (Einzelaktionen) were conducted by the Germans in Hungary with cooperation by the Hungarian authorities. Large numbers (mostly Jews) were sent to the Nazi concentration camps. The initial transports were handled similarly.

<b>After halting the mass deportations</b>			
It was increasingly obvious that Germany and its allies would soon be defeated. Independently, Horthy was pressured by Roosevelt, Churchill and others to stop the deportations. On <b>July 6, 1944</b> he gave instructions to stop them. In spite of this, some transports continued from the vicinity of Budapest on July 8 and few other dates.
